It is difficult to believe that the 2005-2006 school year is quickly coming to an end. This will always be remembered as the year of the tornadoes. We certainly hope this type of event is never repeated. Those of us who have been around for some time remember well 1978 when we had a horrible ice storm. I still call it the year of the ice storm.

Next year we are hopeful that there will be some major changes in the way the regional office produces information. It is our goal to do the Sangamon County School Directory and this newsletter on line. We believe it is time for our office to enter the 21st century technological. We have talked with superintendents and we believe that these projects are possible. Our hope is that we will continue to have a high level of readership once we make this transition.

Certification

We have been invited to many schools this year to do workshops on recertification. We hope that these workshops have been beneficial to those who have attended. When planning your workshops for next year, you may wish to include us for a presentation which lasts about one hour.

About half of the 980 teachers whose certificates are due for renewal this year have completed the process. If your certificate comes due 6/30/06 we want to remind you that certification is a two step process now. Before we can renew your certificate you must show that you have completed the professional development activities necessary for the number of semesters you have taught during this certification cycle. We review your CeRTS or paper Assurance form 79.98 within a few days after we receive them, but ISBE has 30 days to complete their review. If you are unable to complete your part of the process before mid August, you will not have your certification processed before the beginning of the school year. Please complete the process as soon as possible.

If you are a standard certificate holder and your certificate comes due this year and you have completed the process, you are now able to begin your professional development for the next 5 year cycle. If your certificate is due for renewal in 2007 and you have completed your professional development, you may complete the renewal process September 1, 2006. You can then begin the next cycle's required professional development after April 1, 2007.

Some **initial certificate holders** are unable to complete their four years of teaching within the first four year renewal cycle. These individuals are required to renew for another four year cycle. There seems to be a bit of confusion with some individuals who do renew their certificates for the second four year cycle. Once the certificate holder completes four years of teaching they are required to move from an initial to a standard certificate. Individuals who complete their four years of teaching during their second four year renewal cycle will not lose any of their renewal fees. If you finish after one year of the second four year cycle, we will apply the other three years of payment to the first three years of your standard certificate. It is very important that all initial certificate holders move to standard certificates once they have completed four years of teaching.

Following is a table to help those that are up for renewal in **2007**. Once our computers are updated with the 2006-2007 school locations of our Sangamon County teachers, we will be able to print and mail the registration forms to your school.

September 1st, 2006	The date you can electronically send your CERTS (or may be called ECE) to the Regional Office of Education for approval.
A few weeks later	Once your CERTS has been approved by Illinois State Board of Education and Regional Office of Education, you may pay \$25 renewal fee
April 1st, 2007	The date that you may rollover your professional development IF you have paid renewal fees.
_____, 2006/2007	The date that you request representatives from Regional Office of Education to make a presentation on certificate renewal or ask a representative to come register certificates in your building.
